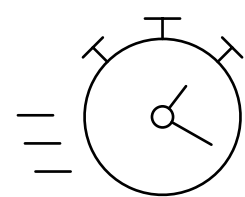

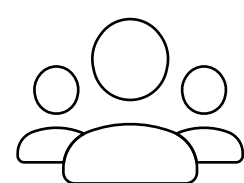

Waitlist to enroll. Wait times vary based on attorney & clinic capacity.

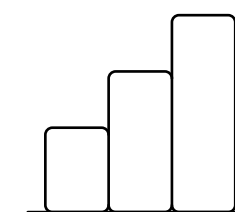
APPROVED

To be eligible, applicants must be Oregonian, under 200% of the poverty guideline, and at risk of removal or facing a civic exclusion due to immigration status.

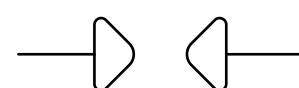
ENROLLED

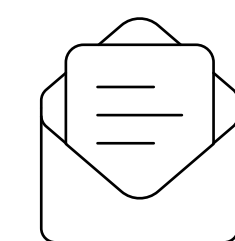


2025 IMMIGRANT JUSTICE FELLOWSHIP COHORT COMMENCES

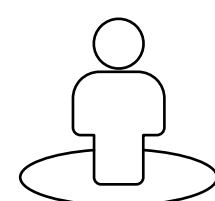
CALL CENTER
