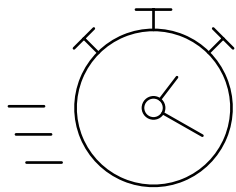

ECO BY THE NUMBERS

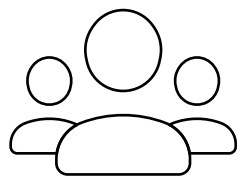

Waitlist to enroll. Wait times vary based on attorney & clinic capacity.

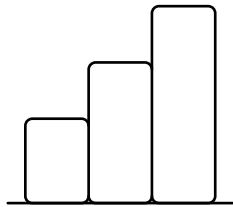
APPROVED

To be eligible, must be Oregonian & under 200% poverty guidelines.

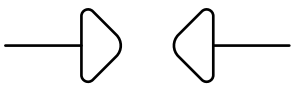
ENROLLED

ECO members are eligible for an array of services throughout their immigration journey.

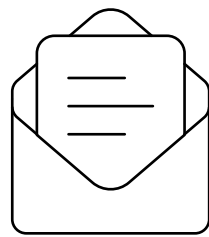
UPDATES



IMMIGRANT JUSTICE FELLOWSHIP

In March, ECO held the recruitment and selection process for four new IJF fellows. Oregon's Immigrant Justice Fellowship provides talented new attorneys with a fully-funded position at an OR-based nonprofit to provide URep services through ECO.

REFERRALS



5,247+ NEW REFERRALS

ECO sends referrals for legal services each month. In March, 48 providers took on 359 + legal matters for Oregonians.

8,200+ MONTHLY CALLS

ECO's Call Center provides a common touch point for ECO members to request and share information about their cases. Average hold time is 4:33 minutes.

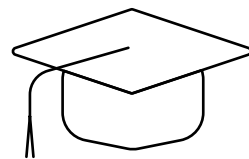
