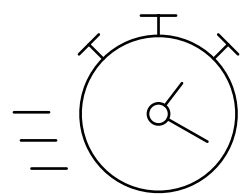

ECO BY THE NUMBERS

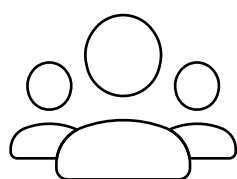

Waitlist to enroll. Wait times vary based on attorney & clinic capacity.

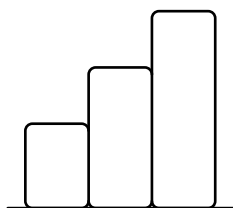
APPROVED

To be eligible, must be Oregonian & under 200% poverty guidelines.

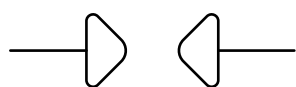
ENROLLED

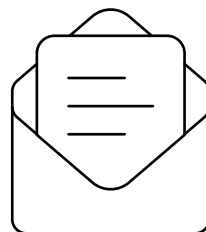


CLINICAL PROVIDERS

A key piece of the ECO service provision are the ECO clinics - legal teams who operate out of community-based organizations in different parts of the state. In May, ECO referred 280+ legal matters out to clinical providers, 250+ of which were accepted.



REFERRALS



4,000 + NEW REFERRALS

ECO sends referrals for legal services each month. In May, 62 providers took on 190+ legal matters for Oregonians.

CALL CENTER



4,200+ MONTHLY CALLS

ECO's call center agents made 660+ outbound calls to schedule appointments. Call center agents facilitate new enrollments and help flag urgencies for the legal team, and updating ECO member contact information

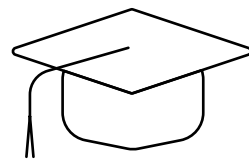
